Daily Quiet Time

"Learn to Trust"

One of the lessons we learned from the story of Bathsheba was the importance of confession. As fallen human beings we all sin, but when we confess our sins God is willing to forgive us. Spend 10 minutes each day this week learning more about what God's Word says about confessing. Begin by looking up the definition of the word confession. You may find more than one definition.

Confession:

Each day do the following:

- 1) Read the selected passages of Scripture for the day.
- 2) Circle the word confess or confession.
- 3) Answer these questions: Who is confessing? What is being confessed? What is the result of the confession? What connection if any do you find between confession and belief in God?
- 4) Meditate stop and think about what you read and about things that you might need to confess.
- 5) Journal write down in the space provided what God reveals to you and how this knowledge might help you to confess more quickly and to trust God with the results.
