Proof of What's To Come

- **Lesson 1 OVERVIEW**: This lesson discusses the fact that God uses a man's hunger, appetite, and different types of food to demonstrate Spiritual truths throughout the Bible. It also gives an overview of the seven appointed feasts that God commanded the people of Israel to observe and how each feast had specific prophetic importance relating to either the First or the Second Coming of Jesus.
- **Lesson 2 The Feasts of Passover and Unleavened Bread**: These two feasts have been celebrated for centuries as a reminder of God's deliverance of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. However the prophetic symbolism of these feasts in regard to the death and burial of Jesus and His deliverance of mankind from our slavery to sin is amazing.
- <u>Lesson 3</u> The Feast of Firstfruits and Feast of Weeks: It's fascinating to study these two feasts because of the incredible pictures they represent of the Resurrection of Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. This lesson also teaches about the Biblical concept of firstfruits and why it's important for us to give God our best.
- **Lesson 4 The First Fall Feast**: This feast is known as the Feast of Trumpets, but is also called **Rosh Hashanah** and marks the beginning of the Jewish New Year. The symbolism and timing of this feast are especially interesting when compared with prophecies concerning the future Rapture of the Church and the Day of the Lord.
- <u>Lesson 5</u> *The Most Solemn Feast*: The next appointed fall feast is *Yom Kippur* also known as the Day of Atonement. This feast is very solemn because it is not a time of celebration, but a time focused on judgment and the need for blood to be shed in order for mercy to be obtained. The fulfillment of the prophecies found in this feast are still future and point to the Second Coming of Jesus.
- <u>Lesson 6</u> *The Most Anticipated Feast*: The Jewish people look forward each year to the Feast of Tabernacles also called the Feast of Booths or Feast of Ingathering. It is a

time of joy, of celebration, and of great prophetic significance as it looks forward to the Millennial Kingdom when God's people will be gathered together and will be able to dwell with Him forever.

- Lesson 7 The Feast of Dedication: This feast is more commonly known as Hanukkah, which is celebrated at the same time as Christmas. This feast celebrates the cleansing and rededication of God's Temple following its defilement by Antiochus Epiphanes. The amazing prophetic implications and timing of this feast however look forward to the time when God's Temple will need to be rededicated following its defilement by the Anti-Christ.
- Lesson 8 The Feast of Purim: This feast is tied to the book of Esther and the miraculous way God delivered the Jewish people from total annihilation. As we study the historical background, plus look at its prophetic significance, once again the details of this feast prove that God is Sovereign and in control of everything that happens in our world today and throughout eternity.
